Next Steps	Prior To Traveling	Upon Arriving
Review your I-20/DS-2019 Check your I-20/DS-2019 and dependent documents, for accuracy. Contact OIA immediately if anything is incorrect: international-affairs@uchicago.edu Pay the I-901 SEVIS Fee Pay the SEVIS Fee and print proof of payment—bring receipt to your visa appointment. Obtain a U.S. Visa Stamp To enter the U.S. as a student, you will need a visa stamp (e.g. F-1/J-1) from a U.S. Consulate or Embassy. Schedule an appointment and review the information for the application process on their website.	Immunization Requirement The State of Illinois and the University of Chicago require students to have proof of immunity and/or vaccinations. Upload your documents to the University of Chicago's Immunization Portal. Health Insurance Options All registered students must have health insurance. Students are automatically enrolled in the University Student Health Insurance Plan (U-SHIP). To learn more: https://wellness.uchicago.edu/student-insurance/u-ship/ To waive U-SHIP, you must provide proof of alternate comparable coverage before the enrollment/ waiver deadline.	Enter the U.S. in your student status Incoming students to the U.S. in F or J status may enter up to 30-days before the program start date listed on the I-20/DS-2019. When you arrive in the U.S. the inspector at the port of entry will verify your I-20/DS-2019. Be sure to have your I-20 or DS-2019, passport, and visa stamp ready for inspection. Retrieve your I-94 Arrival and Departure Record Log onto the Customs and Border Patrol (CBP) website to "GET MOST RECENT I-94" -note: an I-94 arrival record will be issued to you each time you enter the U.S. over the course of your program at UChicago. Best practice: take a screen grab each time and keep a running document of your I-94's!
Bring the following to your visa interview: Complete Online Visa Application (Form DS-160) I-20 or DS-2019 Valid Passport 2x2 photograph(s) Visa Application Fee Receipt SEVIS I-901 Receipt (see above) Proof of financial support Letter of admission from the University of Chicago Check with the Embassy/Consulate for other specific requirements. More information is available at: https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/us-visas.html NOTE: Canadian citizens are not required to apply for a visa stamp, but must obtain an I-20 or DS-2019 and pay the SEVIS Fee (see above). Digital Copies Once you have a U.S. Visa Stamp, scan/savecopiesof all of your important documents including passport, visa stamp and I-20/DS-2019. You may need them for future U.S. immigration benefits. Do not forget to carry-on your immigration documents You will need to present the following upon entry into the U.S.: Passport with Visa I-20 or DS-2019 SEVIS I-901 Receipt Proof of financial support Letter of admission from the University of Chicago Do not pack these documents in checked luggage— you will need them BEFORE you access your checked luggage at the airport.	Submit Required Online Check-In Form to OIA Update your SEVIS U.S. Address in my.uchicago.edu portal and then fill out the online check-in form within 5 business days of arrival in Chicago. You will receive instructions within the OIA Portal. Failure to submit your check-in may result in a termination of your F or J status. Check-In with other UChicago Offices Academic Program Placement Tests (if applicable) Student ID Card & Privileges Office (see back) Student Health Center for immunizations (if applicable) Attend program specific orientations Note dates, times, and locations as specified in emails sent by your academic department.
